Then we're getting longer filter runtimes. Since we, we had the operators cleaned the systems As well as taken apart as well. So as long is, over the next week, we're still seeing the performance we want out of it. And still no leaks will be scheduling. The last filter they completed here in the next couple of weeks in November, when Kester's available to come back. So, hopefully, that's the end of the filter, or a story that's been the past two years, seems to be the answer we've been waiting for. Uh, another thing that was in my Board report was, uh, compensation was at pump station L S 2 one of the pumps has been leaking and failing. It's 20 years old. We had the option we can either, replace it, or repair it, and being of the age of the pump. It makes sense to just do the full replacement of the Pump it doesn't make any sense to invest any additional money into it. So, I just wanted to give the board a heads up. That was a not planned replacement, but we definitely need to do it and we're going to plan for the replacement of the other pump in that pump station, for, next year, since it is definitely exceeded its life expectancy. Um, and lastly, um, on Friday. We had Kester come in and do some preventative maintenance on our Smith ..... pump stations. And .... after they left. We seem to be having, ah, pump issues with one of the pumps, and it's easy, pretty much directly related to they must have touched something or done something since it started two hours after they left. So, the guys got ahold of them first thing this morning, and Kester was very responsive, and they're going to be out here as soon as possible to get it resolved. And we've been managing and all right, because I know, let's say, one of our major pump stations. And they want to get it taken care of as soon as possible. Those were, my updates, if you guys have any questions on anything on my report or. Anything else I gave an update today?

Um, basically, what you have is the Mckinley Building downtown. That was, originally, I guess, it was, for, about four years ago, when they did the first study on that. That was owned by two separate people, at the time. And so there were two line items created for services for that building, two separate services. So Kyle carried numbers in there to serve the porch and paddle with its own service. And then also a service for the other two, to building their 230 to 236 James Street. So with Jeremy now owning the entirety of the building, they've determined they only want one service for the McKinley building. And so to accommodate them where you've removed the porch and paddle line item. And then beyond that, Jeremy has decided to contract directly with somebody to have the equipment installed in the building, I know that he was looking at those special piece, but they haven't thought there until it. So basically this change orders just to remove the line item for the porch and paddle service completely and then to reduce the amount of the McKinley building service to the basement penetration. And it does not no longer includes any other service material that's installed inside the building. So dollar amount, we're talkin'. There's \$12,727 being



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removed for Porch and Paddle. Then for the rest of the McKinley building that Will be reduced by 15,474. 26 on the total amount of this change orders a deduction on \$28,200.
