RESOLUTION # 2023-09 Application for WIIA Program

WHEREAS, the Village Board of Trustees of the Village of Clayton duly caused to be prepared a Preliminary Engineer Report (PER) recommending improvements to the Village water distribution and intake infrastructure; and

WHEREAS, the PER proposed replacement of trouble water mains, valves and hydrants, as well as, replacement of the existing Village water intake system; and

WHEREAS, the plan shows the estimated costs of these improvements to be \$8,234,000; and

WHEREAS, the Village, as a local agency pursuant to the New York State Environmental Quality Review Act ("SEQRA"), ECL Section 8-0101, *et seq.*, and implementing regulations, 6 NYCRR Part 617 (the "Regulations"), having reviewed the impact of the construction of the replacement water distribution infrastructure comprising the Project upon the environment has determined by resolution adopted August 22, 2022 that the Project is a "Type I Action" that will not result in any significant adverse impacts to the environment; and

WHEREAS, the Village Board of Trustees now desires to pursue grant funding for the project under the New York State Water Infrastructure Improvement Act (WIIA) program through the New York State Consolidated Funding Application (CFA); and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Village Board of Trustees of the Village of Clayton, Jefferson County, New York, authorizes the submission of a New York State Water Infrastructure Improvement Act (WIIA) grant application; and

- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that the Mayor is hereby authorized to submit an application on behalf of the Village for grant funding under the New York State Water Infrastructure Improvement Act (WIIA) Program, and to execute any agreements, instruments or other documents in connection with the Village's acceptance of any such grants and/or the funding thereof; and
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED,** that the Mayor may authorize any required local match with respect to financing or grants awarded to the Village for the Project through the use of cash and/or in-kind services; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution shall take effect immediately.

OLD BUSINESS:

1. <u>Alley Way – Grease, garbage</u> – The Board discussed the alley way issue between Channel Side and the Flower Shop. Trustee Buker spoke with the owner, and they will do their best to solve the issues. The Board will keep an eye on the issues and if the issues continue then the Board will have to mail a letter to owners.

MAYOR'S REPORT:

1. <u>2023 NYCOM Annual Meeting in Bolton Landing</u> – Mayor Zimmer discussed the meeting with the Board. She showed the plaque that the Village was given for the NYCOM Local Government Achievement Award Honorable Mention for the Historic District Project. Mayor Zimmer went on to tell the Board that the City of Kingston won an award for launching a Mobile Mental Health Pilot Program. This is the first of its kind in upstate New York. This program will pair a mental healthcare specialist with a Kingston Fire Department Emergency Medical Technician to staff a mobile response unit. The Mobile Mental Health response team of social workers and EMT will have a dedicated ambulance and will provide person-centric crisis response to mental health emergency calls.

The Village of Pelham in Westchester County also won with a 70 million-dollar project for a new transit-oriented development project. This is a 127-unit market-rate mixed-use residential building near the Pelham Metro North train station which will include affordable "workforce" housing and parking garage with EV charging stations. The Village of Lima also won by putting in a \$2.4 million-dollar Water System Upgrade.

2. <u>Mayor Zimmer introduced Robert Wierzba</u> from the Village of Clayton. He introduced himself to the Board and gave reasons why he would like to become more active in the community and would like to be considered as Village Trustee. The Board were all in agreement to appoint him as Village Trustee to serve Tony Randazzo's term of office. He will also be campaigning for this position in November's primary election. He will go into the Village Clerk's office and sign the oath book.

Trustee Hyde presented a **MOTION** to approve the appointment of Robert Wierzba as Village Trustee to serve Tony Randazzo's term; Trustee Buker seconded; all in favor motion carried.
